APPOINTMENTS

We continue to operate a total triage service and all patients that require an appointment with a GP will receive a telephone call first and possible a video consultation if appropriate.

If you have been asked to attend an appointment, please wear a mask/face covering and adhere to social distancing as much as possible. Please stick to your appointment time and do not arrive early or late. We have introduced a range of other measures to keep patients and staff safe during the pandemic, including a screen at our Reception desk and staggered appointment times and sessions in order to avoid too many people in the waiting areas at any time. You may be asked to attend for a blood test appointment in the afternoon rather than the morning. Please use the hand gel provided before and after your appointment.

Please note that all staff will be wearing full PPE.

NEW INTERCOM SYSTEM

We have recently installed an intercom system and politely ask that if you are buzzed into the Practice that you ensure that you enter alone and do not allow other people to follow you into the surgery once the door is opened
